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APPLICATIONS FOR SPRINGBOARD, THE LYRIC HAMMERSMITH THEATRE'S FLAGSHIP TRAINING PROGRAMME ARE NOW OPEN FOR 2024 – 2025

The Lyric Hammersmith Theatre is thrilled to announce that 2024 – 2025 SPRINGBOARD applications are now open for the third year of the ground-breaking, free training programme that aims to find, shape, inspire, and champion the next generation of performers from currently underrepresented groups in theatre. SPRINGBOARD offers unrivalled theatre-based training and development opportunities, as a new alternative performance pathway into employment for future theatre makers who have had little to no formal drama training.

The full company will comprise of 20 people, with 10 places available each year via an audition process. The training programme is a vital addition to **Young Lyric's** pioneering educational initiatives for marginalised young people, highlighting the Lyric's continued commitment to nurture the next generation of talent.

Rachel O'Riordan, Artistic Director & CEO at Lyric Hammersmith Theatre, said: "We are thrilled to soon welcome our new cohort of trainees to SPRINGBOARD. We launched SPRINGBOARD three years ago at the Lyric Hammersmith Theatre as a unique immersive training to champion future generations of talent through a 360-degree hands-on experience delivered by leading industry practitioners. We are building on our long history of talent development and are proud that SPRINGBOARD is a catalyst for bringing real dynamic change in the industry."

Rob Lehmann, Director of Young Lyric, said: "Over the last two years we have seen the incredible impact SPRINGBOARD has had on the young people who have benefited from this programme. Watching our trainees take to the stage, attend professional auditions and secure agents has shown us the significance of providing a training programme that diversifies the

theatre industry by providing a unique pathway for those currently underrepresented in theatre. We are delighted to welcome our third year of SPRINGBOARD trainees, whereby another 10 young actors will gain full access to all areas of the Lyric by performing on our stages and working alongside the incredible artists who will lead our artistic programme throughout 2024 and 2025."

SPRINGBOARD is kindly supported by **Esmée Fairbairn Foundation** and **The Emmanuel Kaye Foundation** whose support has helped to launch a three-year pilot of the programme for the first 30 trainees. SPRINGBOARD is a long-term commitment by the Lyric and will provide an inspiring, industry-leading model to improve access to careers in the theatre. SPRINGBOARD's ambition is to be a template for UK arts organisations to adapt or adopt, actively making the performing arts sector more inclusive with a workforce which better represents society.

Successful applicants will be enrolled in the free training programme, benefiting from a bursary that will support them while they take part in a wide range of development initiatives including performances, workshops, masterclasses, artist development and opportunities both on and off the stage.

The Lyric Hammersmith Theatre is committed to championing young talent from West London and is encouraging applicants to apply who are from the Global Majority, not in education or training, who are non-binary, LGBTQIA+, who are d/Deaf or disabled. Applicants must be aged 18-25 from the programme start date (10 January 2023), have little or no formal drama training, and live in one of the eligible West London boroughs - Brent, Ealing, Hammersmith and Fulham, Harrow, Hillingdon, Hounslow, Kensington and Chelsea, Richmond upon Thames, Wandsworth and Westminster.

The deadline for applications is **Wednesday 15 November 2023**. Group auditions will take place on **Monday 20 November**, and if successful, the second round of auditions will take place on **Friday 24 November**.
