Lorraine Hansberry's *A Raisin in the Sun* contains language and scenes that may impact some audience members. Details are outlined below – **please note the following does contain spoilers.**

The play is set in 1957 in Chicago, and depicts an African American family who are fighting to break free of the prejudices that society placed on Black people in post-war America. The characters experience the effects of racism, classism and generational trauma.

The play contains instances of racially explicit and homophobic language and depictions of racist behaviour. There are also depictions of substance abuse and homophobic language, as well as discussions of abortion. There is a small amount of fake blood shown, as well as live cooking of eggs on stage.
