

SING STREET CONTENT WARNINGS

Sing Street contains themes that may impact some audience members. Details are outlined below – **please note the following does contain plot spoilers**.

Sing Street is set in Dublin in the 1980s, a time of significant economic and social changes including recession, a high unemployment rate and emigration.

This production contains strong language including homophobic languages/slurs; mild drug references; a reference to sexual abuse; depictions of bullying.

This production is most suitable for ages 12+. Under 14s must be accompanied by a full paying adult. It remains the responsibility of the accompanying adult to judge the suitability of the show for children in advance of purchase.
